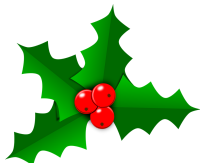

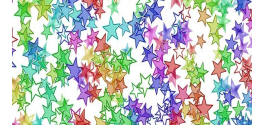

Ever 'wonder' what hooks a child to a book? You know what I'm talking about. When your child won't go to bed until the next chapter. When your child wakes up in the middle of the night with a flashlight and hides under the covers to finish the book. Or, when your child misses their bus stop or doesn't finish breakfast in time because their nose is stuck in a book! These books encourage imagination, creativity and a sense of wonder.

R.J. Palacio's book entitled, *Wonder*, is this type of book. Many people read it in one sitting. It hooks readers of all ages; from the very young to adulthood. It contains life lessons and questions about how we see the world. If you get the chance to read this book as a family, please do. I can promise

you will have engaging conversation and learn how each member of your family views the world.

The popularity of this book has inspired Hollywood to make a movie out of it. If the movie inspires you, maybe you will be inspired to then read the book. The second book associated with *Wonder* is called, *Auggie and Me...* another amazing read.

So you are thinking about playing an instrument in the SGMS Beginning Band! Great! Learning how to play a wind instrument in a group setting is an excellent way to explore and discover the joys of making music. Here are some details you should know.

The Beginning Band is a 13-week introductory ensemble for students to learn the fundamentals and proper playing techniques of band instruments. All Parkland School Division students who are in grades 5 to 9 are welcome to join. **Rehearsals are Wednesdays** in the music room at École Broxton Park School from 3:30-4:30. Our first practice is January 17 and our last practice will be April 25. One clinic will be scheduled for early March which will extend this rehearsal 30 minutes longer to 5:00.

Instruments of the beginning band include flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, baritone and percussion (snare drum, bass drum, bells). Instruments can be rented through the school; it is expected that students will play their selected instrument for the duration of the session. It is recommended that students pick up their instrument before the first rehearsal.

The fee for beginning band is \$60 - This covers instrument rental, clinician fees, and other supplies. If an instrument is privately owned the fee is adjusted accordingly. Cheques are payable to PSD70. Fees can be paid either in the school office, or online once your child is registered.

Being part of a band is more than just playing music! It provides students with an environment to imagine and invent, it fosters commitment and self-discipline, and it requires determination. These characteristics contribute to success in life.
